Peregrine Academic Services provides nationally normed, summative assessment services for Business Administration academic programs that are used for internal and external programmatic evaluation. The service is designed to address varying accreditation requirements that a university or department might need to satisfy. This service allows the stakeholders to assess designated learning outcomes and compare their performance via external benchmarking to other academic institutions.

The Nathan M. Bisk College of Business uses the Peregrine Common Professional Component Business Exam in the capstone class for the Masters of Business Administration program. The results for the 2020 calendar year are below in which they are compared to the following academic institution categories:
